

## Lily Guarneros Maase & Curandera

New excavations of old myths for guitar, chamber ensemble and non-binary voice.

Multi-genre guitarist and composer Lily
Maase explores the relationship
between genre and gender in this
ensemble dedicated to queer
femininity, ancient storytelling and the
genderless voice. This is the New
Mexican-born guitarist's first formal
offering as a singer-songwriter
following a storied career as a jazz
composer and session guitarist in both
Los Angeles and New York.
Recommended for fans of Joanna
Newsom, Bill Frisell, Memphis Minnie,
and all things related to the complex
history & tradition of the acoustic guitar.

## About Lily Maase

Meximerican guitarist, composer and educator **Lily Guarneros Maase** spent 15 years playing experimental music in and around New York before moving to

Los Angeles in 2019; she is currently faculty of guitar, songwriting and audio production at CalArts and LACM. Maase will release two collections of original work on Infrequent Seams in 2023–blood::face in April and teeth::bones in December—as a part of their year-long K7 Commissioning Series.

## About the Ensemble

Founded as an homage to seminal female guitarists Elizabeth Cotten, Memphis Minnie and Rosetta Tharpe, **Curandera** is a contemporary folk ensemble dedicated to transforming misogynist themes in ancient lore into tales of empowerment, redemption and hope. Lily Maase's strengths as an instrumentalist and storyteller lay the foundation for this interdisciplinary group, which features a chorus of nonbinary voices, jazz rhythm section and projected illustrations by the late New Mexican visual artist Marcelo Gallegos (1984-2022). Curandera will be featured on both of Maase's upcoming Infrequent Seams releases and will premiere *The Tale of the Bloody River*, a long-form retelling of the Llorona myth, in Los Angeles this coming fall.
